PROVIDE A STABLE, SAFE, AND SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

- We currently have an online referral system for staff to use to refer students to the program.
- We help with homework and provide a quiet space for focus.
- We play games that involve reading, spelling, math and work on those skills.

- We are in contact with teachers often regarding areas of struggle for our kids and areas we can work on.
- We provide one-on-one homework help.
- We are available daily for staff to communicate about students who may be struggling or areas we should focus on.
