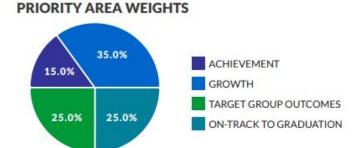

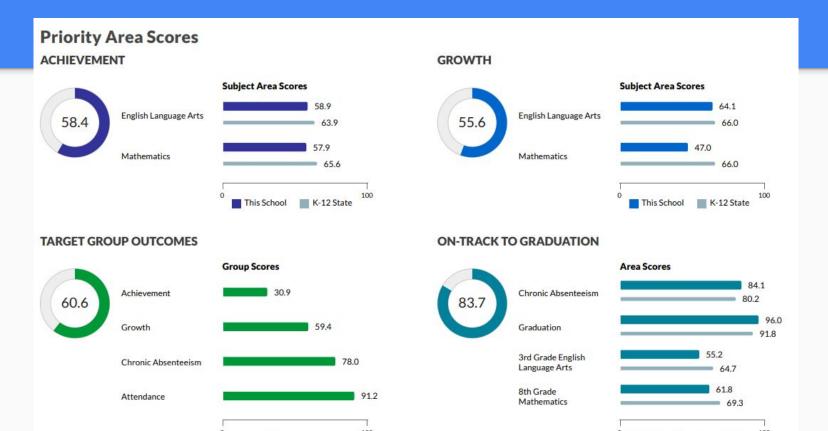

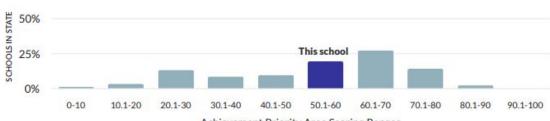

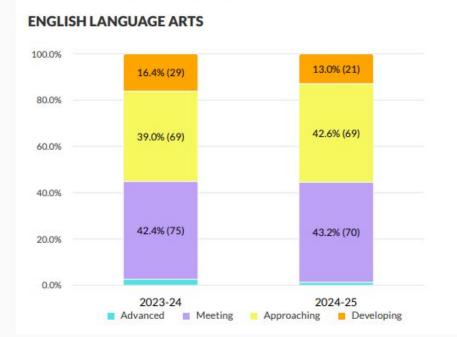


Achievement Priority Area Scoring Ranges

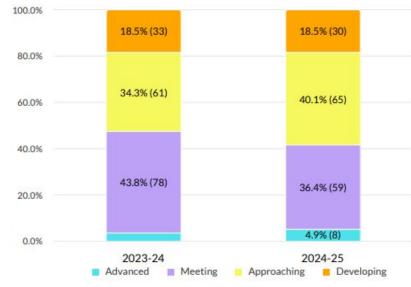
### Overall State Testing Performance

### Growth

#### **GROWTH**

This priority area measures year-to-year student progress on statewide tests. It uses a value-added model that seeks to control for circumstances beyond the influence of educators. A high value-added score means that on average students in the school are progressing more quickly than other, similar students. Growth is scored from 0 to 100 to match the other priority areas and is a conversion from the roughly 0 to 6 value-added score.

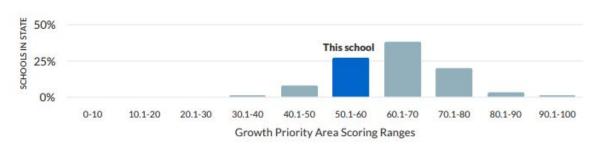

### Target Group Outcomes

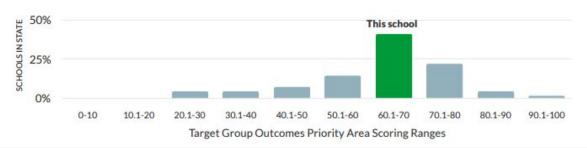
#### TARGET GROUP OUTCOMES

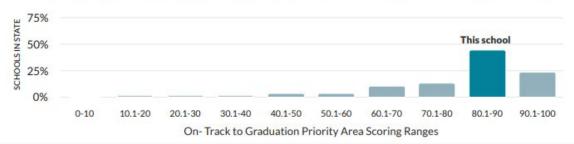
#### **ON-TRACK TO GRADUATION**

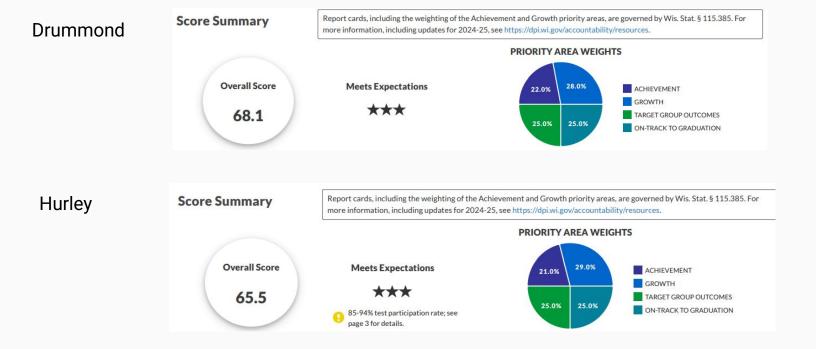


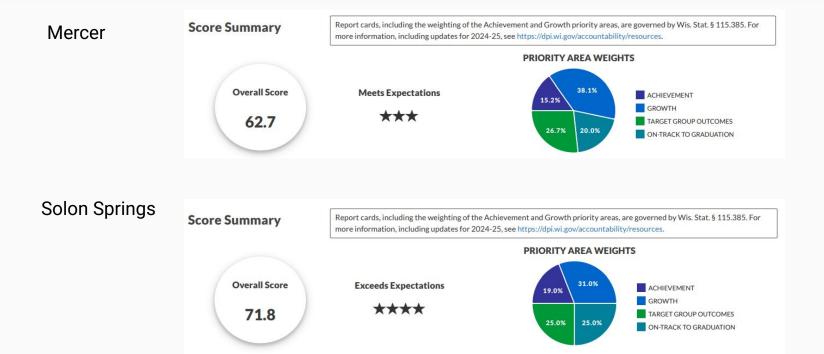
